#### **School Responsibilities**

The Nebinger Elementary School will:

  - Progress monitoring of student academics, behaviors and attendance
  - Conducting frequent informal classroom observations to monitor instruction, Formal Teacher observations and Professional Development Plans for Teachers, and an after school enrichment program.
2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows: by contacting the main office secretary and/or Principal to schedule an appointment during preparation periods, report card conferences, parent/teacher conferences
5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- Parents may volunteer for student arrival, dismissal and after school programs, assist in the lunchrooms, classrooms, and main office.
- Parents may volunteer to become a member of the Home and School Association, School Advisory Counsel, Safe Corridors Program, and tutoring, etc
- Parent may observe classrooms upon scheduling an appointment to observe their child's class through the main office Secretary/ Principal and during Two Chairs at a Desk held 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month
- Parents are encouraged to participate in Coffee with the Principal once a month, Parent workshops, Open Houses, School Trips, Back to School Night, School Events

### **Parent Responsibilities**

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:
